Public Involvement Plan Form

Requirement of TCEQ's Public Participation Plan

Provides basic information about the area in which an applicant will be operating

Basic demographic information will assist the applicant in determining if any kind of enhanced public outreach might be necessary during the application process

Including, but not limited too, translation and interpretation efforts to ensure equal access for Limited English Proficient communities and individuals



Purpose of the Public Involvement Plan

Permit applicants have an important role in ensuring effective public participation.

Intended to assist applicants in knowing the communities in which they are operating, and if any type of enhanced public outreach is necessary for equal access.

Host public meetings (when required)

Provide information required by statute and regulations

Applicants may be required to provide simultaneous oral interpretation in alternative languages at public meetings and provide notices in alternative languages.

Public Involvement Plan Form for Permit and Registration Applications

The Public Involvement Plan is intended to provide applicants and the agency with information about how public outreach will be accomplished for certain types of applications in certain geographical areas of the state. It is intended to apply to new activities; major changes at existing plants, facilities, and processes; and to activities which are likely to have significant interest from the public. This preliminary screening is designed to identify applications that will benefit from an initial assessment of the need for enhanced public outreach.

All applicable sections of this form should be completed and submitted with the permit or registration application. For instructions on how to complete this form, see TCEQ-20960-inst.

Who is required to complete the form?

Form Not Required

Applications that only:

- Move a diversion point
- Add a purpose or place of use
- Non-substantive changes to a water right

Form Required

- New appropriations
- New Reservoirs
- Amendments that add new water
- Increase in diversion rate
- Reuse applications

 Check yes if the application requires published notice in a newspaper


Significant Public Interest

- The project typically has public interest in the river basin
- Past permitting actions in the basin had significant public interest
- Discussed during the pre-application meeting
