WHEREAS, by final decree of the 33rd District Court of Llano County, in Cause No. 5,538, In Re: The Adjudication of Water Rights in the Llano River Watershed of the Colorado River Basin, dated September 24, 1979, a right was recognized under Claim 209 authorizing L. D. Jetton to appropriate waters of the State of Texas as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, this certificate of adjudication to appropriate waters of the State of Texas in the Colorado River Basin is issued to L. D. Jetton, subject to the following terms and conditions:

#### 1. USE

Owner is authorized to divert and use not to exceed 196 acre-feet of water per annum from the underflow of the South Llano River and directly from the South Llano River to irrigate a maximum of 98 acres of land out of a 1076.99 acre tract in Edwin Quinby Survey 371, Abstract 436, Kimble County, Texas, said 1076.99 acre tract being described as follows:

- (1) BEGINNING at the top of bluff on the East bank of the South Llano River, for the Northwest corner of the Edwin Quinby Survey 371;
- (2) THENCE S  $00^{\circ}55^{\circ}E$ , 3701.5 varas to a fence corner on top of a mountain for the Southwest corner of this tract;
- (3) THENCE East, 1170 varas to a fence corner for the Southeast corner of this tract;
- (4) THENCE North, 5318 varas to a fence corner at cattle guard on road;
- (5) THENCE N 79°21'W, 1000 varas to a stake on East bank of the South Llano River;
- (6) THENCE up said river with its meanders to the place of beginning, containing 1076.99 acres of land, more or less.

#### 2. DIVERSION

#### A. Location:

- (1) From any of five wells which tap the underflow of the South Llano River and are located on the east bank of said river at points S 21°E, 920 feet, N 84°30'E, 1275 feet, N 80°E, 525 feet, N 56°30'E, 1750 feet and N 16°30'E, 4030 feet from the northwest corner of the aforesaid survey.
- (2) At any point on the east bank of the South Llano River which borders this water right between an upstream point which is located at the northwest corner of the aforesaid survey and a downstream point which is N 08°30'E, 5050 feet from northwest corner of the aforesaid survey.
- B. Maximum Combined Rate: 1.45 cfs (650 gpm).

#### 3. PRIORITY

The time priority of owner's right is 1920.

This certificate of adjudication is issued subject to senior and superior water rights in the Colorado River Basin.

This certificate of adjudication is issued subject to the Rules of the Texas Department of Water Resources and its continuing right of supervision of State water resources consistent with the public policy of the State as set forth in the Texas Water Code.

This water right is appurtenant to the above-described land within which irrigation is authorized, unless and until severed from the land. A transfer of any portion of the above-described land includes, unless otherwise specified, that portion of the water right which is appurtenant to the transferred land at the time of the transaction.



# WORKSHEET 7.0 ACCOUNTING PLAN INFORMATION WORKSHEET

The following information provides guidance on when an Accounting Plan may be required for certain applications and if so, what information should be provided. An accounting plan can either be very simple such as keeping records of gage flows, discharges, and diversions; or, more complex depending on the requests in the application. Contact the Surface Water Availability Team at 512-239-4600 for information about accounting plan requirements, if any, for your application. **Instructions, Page 34.** 

#### 1. Is Accounting Plan Required

Accounting Plans are generally required:

- For applications that request authorization to divert large amounts of water from a single point where multiple diversion rates, priority dates, and water rights can also divert from that point;
- For applications for new major water supply reservoirs;
- For applications that amend a water right where an accounting plan is already required, if the amendment would require changes to the accounting plan;
- For applications with complex environmental flow requirements;
- For applications with an alternate source of water where the water is conveyed and diverted; and
- For reuse applications.

### 2. Accounting Plan Requirements

#### a. A **text file** that includes:

- 1. an introduction explaining the water rights and what they authorize;
- 2. an explanation of the fields in the accounting plan spreadsheet including how they are calculated and the source of the data;
- 3. for accounting plans that include multiple priority dates and authorizations, a section that discusses how water is accounted for by priority date and which water is subject to a priority call by whom; and
- 4. Should provide a summary of all sources of water.

#### b. A **spreadsheet** that includes:

- 1. Basic daily data such as diversions, deliveries, compliance with any instream flow requirements, return flows discharged and diverted and reservoir content;
- 2. Method for accounting for inflows if needed;
- 3. Reporting of all water use from all authorizations, both existing and proposed;
- 4. An accounting for all sources of water;
- 5. An accounting of water by priority date;
- 6. For bed and banks applications, the accounting plan must track the discharged water from the point of delivery to the final point of diversion;
- Accounting for conveyance losses;
- 8. Evaporation losses if the water will be stored in or transported through a reservoir. Include changes in evaporation losses and a method for measuring reservoir content resulting from the discharge of additional water into the reservoir;
- 9. An accounting for spills of other water added to the reservoir; and
- 10. Calculation of the amount of drawdown resulting from diversion by junior rights or diversions of other water discharged into and then stored in the reservoir.
