INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

Vistra Corporate Services Company LLC (Vistra) owns Certificate of Adjudication 12-4097 (the "Certificate"), which authorizes it to: (1) maintain an existing dam and reservoir on Panther Creek and an existing dam and reservoir on Squaw Creek and impound therein not to exceed a combined total of 151,500 acre-feet of water in the two reservoirs; and (2) divert and consumptively use not to exceed a combined 23,180 acre-feet of water per annum from the aforesaid reservoirs for the operation of owners nuclear-fueled electric power generating plant and industrial (condenser cooling) purposes. The Certificate is attached hereto as Attachment B.

The Certificate is the source of water for cooling and operating needs at the Comanche Peak Nuclear Power Plant (CPNPP). Vistra wishes to have the ability to sell or lease water appropriated under the Certificate to others so that the water may be beneficially used within Squaw Creek Reservoir, located within Hood and Somervell Counties.

Through this application, Vistra respectfully requests that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (the "Commission") amend the Certificate to 1) Add Industrial, agricultural and recreational consumptive uses to Sections 2.A.;. 2) Amend the use description in Section 2.A. to read "Owner is authorized to divert and use not to exceed 2,400 acre-feet of water per annum from Squaw Creek Reservoir for industrial, agricultural and recreational use. 3) Add agricultural and recreational consumptive uses to Section 2.B. 4) Amend the use description in Section 2.B. to delete "(condenser cooling)" from the currently authorized industrial use. 5) Amend the diversion point to specify the location of use is located in Hood and Somervell Counties; 6) Amend the description in Section 3.B.1 to read "from Squaw Creek Reservoir for industrial, agricultural and recreational use.".

No other amendment to the Certificate is requested.

The amendments also seek to cure ambiguous and ineffective provisions within the Certificate.

The proposed amendment would add flexibility to the beneficial purposes to which the appropriated water can be applied. Maximizing efficiency of surface water use in Squaw Creek Reservoir is in the public interest and is not detrimental to the public welfare.

Under Texas Water Code Section 11.151, the Commission must consider the potential effects of the Application, if any, on groundwater or groundwater recharge. The Application requests only amendments that would add flexibility and clarification to the existing Certificate of Adjudication. It will have no impact on groundwater resources, either by withdrawal or recharge.

As required by Texas Water Code Section 11.134(b)(3)(E), the proposed amendment addresses a water supply need in a manner that is consistent with the State Water Plan and the relevant approved regional water plan. The proposed amendment seeks to add flexibility to the Certificate so that it can be used to meet those needs. 1. IMPOUNDMENT

Owner is authorized to maintain an existing dam and reservoir on Panther Creek and an existing dam and reservoir on Squaw Creek and impound therein not to exceed a combined total of 151,500 acre-feet of water in the two reservoirs. The dam on Panther Creek is located in the William B. Smith Survey, Abstract 90 and the dam on Squaw Creek is located in the Jose Antonio Hernandez Survey, Abstract 41, Somervell County, Texas.

2. USE

A. Owner is authorized to divert and use not to exceed 2400 acre-feet of water per annum from the Squaw Creek reservoir for ancillary purposes in the operation of owner's nuclear-fueled electric power generating plant.

Industrial, agricultural and recreational use.

B. Owner is authorized to divert, circulate and recirculate water in the Squaw Creek reservoir and to consumptively use not to exceed 20,780 acre-feet of water per annum for industrial (condenser cooling) purposes. Add agricultural and recreational uses

3. DIVERSION

A. Location
At the perimeter of the aforesaid reservoirs, located in Hood and Somervell Counties

B. Maximum combined rate:

(1) 4900 cfs (2,200,000 gpm) from Squaw Creek Reservoir for normal operation of the power generating plant: industrial, agricultural and recreational use

(2) 200 cfs (90,000 gpm) from aforesaid reservoirs for emergency shutdown operations. (3) 37 cfs (16,660 gpm) from Squaw Creek Reservoir to Lake Granhury via pipeline.

4. PRIORITY

The time priority of owner's right is April 25, 1973.

5. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- A. Owner shall maintain suitable outlets in the aforesaid dams authorized herein to allow the free passage of water that owner is not entitled to divert or impound.
- B. Water diverted from Squaw Creek Reservoir and not consumed will be returned to the reservoir at a point which bears N 45°E, 2930 feet from the south corner of the Wm. B. Smith Survey, Abstract 90, Somervell County, Texas.
- C. Water diverted from Squaw Creek Reservoir and not beneficially used will be returned at a point which bears N 60°15'E, 8120 feet from the south corner of the Jose Antonio Hernandez Survey, Abstract 41, Somervell County, Texas.
- D. Water pumped from Squaw Creek Reservoir to Lake Granbury for quality control purposes will enter Lake Granbury at a point which is S 79°E, 3235 feet from the east corner of the Alexander O'Brien Survey, Abstract 433, Hood County, Texas.
- E. Owner shall make sufficient releases from the reservoir or from the pipeline from Lake Granbury to maintain a minimum flow of 1.50 cfs at the Highway 144 crossing over Squaw Creek which is approximately 12,000 feet downstream from the dam.
- F. Owner shall maintain a continuous lake level measuring station for Squaw Creek Reservoir and maintain the following records, compiled monthly:
 - (1) Reservoir content;
 - (2) Consumptive use including forced evaporation;
 - (3) Discharges through the Squaw Creek Dam;
 - (4) Water pumped into Squaw Creek Reservoir from Lake Granbury;
 - (5) Water pumped from Squaw Creek Reservoir into Lake Granbury.
- G. Revised elevation-area-capacity tables based on new sediment surveys conducted at 10-year intervals following the first filling of the reservoir shall be submitted to the Commission.
- H. Owner is authorized to store water diverted from Lake Granbury under Contractual Permit 20 in the Squaw Creek Reservoir for subsequent diversion and use to the extent authorized herein.

The locations of pertinent features related to this certificate are shown on Page 20 of the Brazos II River Segment Certificates of Adjudication Maps, copies of which are located in the offices of the Texas Water Commission, Austin, Texas and the Somervell County Clerk.

This certificate of adjudication is issued subject to all terms, conditions and provisions in the final decree of the 91st Judicial District Court of Eastland County, Texas, in Cause No. 32.002, In Re: The Adjudication of Water Rights in the Brazos II River Segment of the Brazos River Basin, dated November 8, 1985, and supersedes all rights of the owner asserted in that cause.
