Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (Owner/Applicant) seeks to amend a portion of Certificate of Adjudication No. 06-4412 to add instream as a purpose of use and to deposit 611 acre-feet of water into the Texas Water Trust in perpetuity. More information on the application and how to participate in the permitting process is given below.

APPLICATION. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, 4200 Smith School Road Austin, TX 78744, Applicant, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an amendment to a Certificate of Adjudication pursuant to Texas Water Code § 11.122 and Rules Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 295.1, *et seq.* Mailed notice to the record holders is required pursuant to Title 30 TAC § 295.158(c)(2)(A).

A portion of Certificate of Adjudication No. 06-4412 (Certificate) authorizes Texas Parks and Wildlife Department to divert and use not to exceed 611 acre-feet of water per year from a point on Indian Creek, at an unspecified diversion rate, for agricultural and wetland purposes in Jasper County.

The time priority of owner's right is February 21, 1931.

Applicant seeks to amend its portion of Certificate to add instream use to the 611 acre-feet of water per year authorized for diversion.

Applicant also seeks to amend its portion of Certificate to authorize the deposit of the 611 acre-feet of water into the Texas Water Trust in perpetuity.

The application was received on September 15, 2025. Additional information was received on September 30, 2025, and October 13, 2025. The application was declared administratively complete and accepted for filing with the Office of the Chief Clerk on October 21, 2025.

The Executive Director completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft amendment. The draft amendment, if granted, would include special conditions, including execution of a Texas Water Trust Agreement. CONTESTED CASE HEARING. The TCEQ may grant a contested case hearing on this application if a written hearing request is filed by December 17, 2025. The Executive Director can consider an approval of the application unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed by December 17, 2025.

To request a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "[*I/we*] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a brief and specific description of how you would be affected by the application in a way not common to the general public; and (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the proposed activity. You may also submit proposed conditions for the requested permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address provided in the information section below.



PURPOSE

This policy designates appropriate signature and approval authority for Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) documents and transactions.

BACKGROUND

This policy affects all TPWD employees as it pertains to the signature authority and approval of documents and transactions on behalf of TPWD.

DEFINITIONS

contract

for purposes of this policy, any agreement (including electronic) between TPWD and any other party in which TPWD or another party commits to taking any action or disbursing or receiving anything of value. This includes but is not limited to purchasing contracts, revenue contracts, memoranda of agreement, memoranda of understanding, letters of agreement, surface use agreements, easements, leases, state park concession contracts, construction contracts, land contracts, and grant agreements.

total contract value ("value")

the contract amount to be expended or received by TPWD, in any form, including but not limited to money, land, rights, materials, goods, or services, throughout the contract term, to include any value that is donated or is a match requirement per the terms of the contract.

POLICY STATEMENT

The TPWD Executive Director (ED) has delegated the authority to sign and/or approve documents and transactions on behalf of TPWD to certain TPWD employees as stated in this policy. The approval listed is the lowest level at which each document type or action may be approved unless a designee is authorized in writing, after all appropriate and required levels of review or coordination. Higher approval levels retain the authority to approve the listed documents, after proper review. The person to whom such signature/approval authority is delegated is the final signature/approval authority for the item listed. However, additional reviews prior to final

signature/approval may be required and coordinated with the Purchasing and Contracting Branch, the Legal Division, and/or the Infrastructure Division, as discussed below.

Supervisors and other approvers are required to approve certain documents (e.g., travel, membership authorization, leave requests) *prior* to submission. A person who is serving in an "acting" capacity is authorized to sign/approve for that position, except for the State Agency Uniform Nepotism Disclosure Form developed by the State Auditor's Office. In addition, a signatory/approver may authorize another individual to be their designee in the event the signatory/approver is unavailable. TPWD employees who report directly to the Chief Operating Officer (COO) or ED must obtain COO signature/approval for their own requests.

All TPWD documents and transactions must be approved in accordance with this policy. Supervisors should provide guidance to employees on when it is acceptable to use alternatives to original signatures, such as electronic signatures and email confirmation of approval.

If a signatory/approver believes that they may need to recuse themselves due to a conflict of interest in signing or approving the document, they should consult with the Legal Division to determine whether another signatory/approver is appropriate.

LEGAL REVIEW

Many documents and transactions require review by the appropriate attorney in the Legal Division prior to signature. This includes the following:

- All documents and transactions where this policy requires approval by the Executive Office (i.e., PC Director, COO, or ED), and any document presented to the Commission.
- All contracts. However, the appropriate Legal Division attorney may determine that a
 particular contract, such as an agreement on an approved template, does not require legal
 review. Such determinations should be documented (e.g., email).
- Other items listed below that are marked with an asterisk (*).

In the event it is unclear whether a document requires legal review, an employee should contact the GC for guidance.

PURCHASING AND CONTRACTING

The Purchasing and Contracting Branch serves as the agency coordinator for all contracts, except for state park concession contracts, recreation grant agreements, construction contracts, and contracts for construction-related professional services (e.g., engineering or architectural services). Construction contracts and contracts for construction-related professional services will be coordinated through the Contracting Branch of the Infrastructure Division. State Park concession contracts and recreation grants will be coordinated through the State Parks Division.

Each division must assign at least one point-of-contact or administrator to work with the Purchasing and Contracting Branch for contract documents. The person to whom signature/approval authority is delegated by this policy and the divisional point-of-contact for

contract documents are responsible for ensuring that appropriate review, coordination, routing, and reporting take place.

All contract documents, once executed, must be provided to the Purchasing and Contracting Branch, Infrastructure Division, or the designated purchaser as appropriate. All contract documents should be entered into the financial system upon receipt of a fully signed contract, preferably within 7 business days of receipt. Additionally, contracts that exceed certain dollar thresholds must be reported to the Legislative Budget Board (LBB) as well as any other oversight reporting as required and as outlined in the TPWD Contract Management Guide (BF-18-01).

- For applications that amend a water right where an accounting plan is already required, if the amendment would require changes to the accounting plan;
- For applications with complex environmental flow requirements;
- For applications with an alternate source of water where the water is conveyed and diverted; and
- For reuse applications.

b. A **spreadsheet** that includes:

- 1. Basic daily data such as diversions, deliveries, compliance with any instream flow requirements, return flows discharged and diverted and reservoir content;
- 2. Method for accounting for inflows if needed;
- 3. Reporting of all water use from all authorizations, both existing and proposed:
- 4. An accounting for all sources of water;
- 5. An accounting of water by priority date;
- 6. For bed and banks applications, the accounting plan must track the discharged water from the point of delivery to the final point of diversion;
- 7. Accounting for conveyance losses:
- 8. Evaporation losses if the water will be stored in or transported through a reservoir. Include changes in evaporation losses and a method for measuring reservoir content resulting from the discharge of additional water into the reservoir:
- 9. An accounting for spills of other water added to the reservoir; and
- 10. Calculation of the amount of drawdown resulting from diversion by junior rights or diversions of other water discharged into and then stored in the reservoir.

Marshal Criteria – Addendum

RESPONSE: Based upon a review of the completed responses to the application to amend CoA 06-4412 to add instream uses and dedicate 611 ac-ft/yr to the Texas Water Trust, including a review of the requirements of Chapter 11, Texas Water Code, and Chapters 281,295 and 297 of Title 30 of the Texas Administrative Code, and Chapter 8503, Texas Special District Local Laws Code, TPWD believes the application to be complete. TPWD further believes the application includes all the required documentation including maps and appropriate fees.

RESPONSE: The proposed amendment does not request a new appropriation of water, diversion point(s), or change in discharge rates. The proposed amendment requests to add 611 ac-ft/yr of water to the Texas Water Trust, which will help maintain environmental flows in the Neches River basin pursuant to 30 TAC §298.280. Donations to the Texas Water Trust meet beneficial use criteria listed in TWC § 11.023 such as providing water for recreation and pleasure.

RESPONSE: The proposed amendment does not request a new appropriation of water, diversion point(s), or change in discharge rates. RESPONSE: The state and regional water plans generally do not address every possible change in individual water rights. This application is consistent with the 2021 Region I Water Plan and the 2022 State Water Plan because there is nothing in the plans that conflict with this application.

The water management plan also includes provisions to help meet environmental flow needs in the Neches River Basin.
