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<b>Standard Permit for Certain Temporary Concrete Plants for Public Works</b>  (SB 1397 Section 1, 2, 3/ Sunset Rec New)	<p>Standard Permit for Certain Temporary Concrete Plants for Public Works - Commission may develop by rule the criteria to establish a de minimis level of air contaminants for facilities, below which certain permits are not required. The changes revise and reformat Texas Health &amp; Safety Code Section 382.05101 and provide that a standard permit under new Section 382.051985, Standard Permit for Certain Temporary Concrete Plants for Public Works, is one of the permit types not required for facilities or groups of facilities falling below de minimis levels set forth in commission rules.</p> <p>Provides one mechanism by which the commission may authorize changes in a federal source to proceed prior to the owner or operator obtaining a federal operating permit or revisions to a federal operating permit.</p> <p>Creates a new standard permit specifically for supporting public works projects. Commission shall issue a standard permit for temporary plants that meets the requirements of Section 382.05195 for a temporary concrete plant that performs wet batching, dry batching, or central mixing to support a public works project. Plants operating under the permit may not support a project that is not related to the public works project, must be located in or contiguous to the right-of-way of the public works project, and may occupy a designated site for not more than 180 consecutive days or to supply material for a single project, but not other unrelated projects.</p>	None	Implementation of this item is in progress.  <a href="#">Proposed Air Quality Standard Permit for Temporary Public Works Projects</a> was published in the November 1, 2024, edition of the Texas Register ( <a href="#">49 TexReg 8772-8773</a> ). 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<b>Electronic Posting of Permit Applications</b>  (SB 1397 Section 11/ Sunset Rec 1.5)	<p>Electronic Posting of Permit Applications - Commission must post on its website a permit application and associated materials at the time that an application becomes administratively complete, including any maps that are part of applications for permit applications under Texas Water Code Chapter 11 Subchapter D. If a permit application is revised or amended after the permit application has become administratively complete, the commission must also post on its website the revised or amended permit application. Commission may exempt any associated materials from being posted on its website if the commission determines that posting the materials on the website would be unduly burdensome or the materials are too large to be posted. Notwithstanding any other law, the commission must also require an applicant for permit applications that require published notice to include in the notice the address of the website where the public can access information about the permit. <b>Compliance History Rating Formula Considerations</b>  (Management Action/ Sunset Rec 2.1)	<p>Compliance History Rating Formula Considerations - Directs TCEQ to review and update the agency's compliance history rating formula to ensure it accurately reflects a regulated entity's record of violations, including considerations of site complexity and cumulative violations or multiple violations of the same type. TCEQ should specifically consider major, moderate, and repeat occurrences of the same minor violations when calculating compliance history ratings. Finally, TCEQ should regularly update an entity's compliance history rating throughout the year as the agency receives additional information that could alter the rating.</p> <p>When updating the agency's compliance history rating formula, TCEQ should determine whether its current formula adequately allows for comparing the compliance performance of facilities of similar complexity. 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<b>Increase Maximum Administrative Penalty</b>  (SB 1397 Section 14, 24/ Sunset Rec New)	<p>Increase Maximum Administrative Penalty - Criteria for assessing up to \$40,000 per violation per day is stated in new (c)(1), (2) and (3) of the Texas Water Code Section 7.052, as follows: (1) the violation involves: (A) an actual release of pollutants to the air, water, or land that exceeds levels protective of human health or environmental receptors; or (B) an actual unauthorized diversion, taking, or storage of state water, or an unauthorized change in the flood elevation of a stream that deprives others of water, severely affects aquatic life, or results in a safety hazard, property damage, or economic loss. (2) the person previously committed a violation of the same nature that resulted in the assessment of an administrative penalty; and (3) the commission determines that the person could have reasonably anticipated and avoided the violation.</p> <p>Change applies only to a violation that occurs on or after September 1, 2023. <b>Enforcement Diversion Program for Small Businesses and Local Governments</b>  (SB 1397 Section 15/ Sunset Rec New)	<p>Enforcement Diversion Program for Small Businesses and Local Governments - Provides a definition for "small business" and that the commission must establish the program which must include (1) resources developed for the small business compliance assistance program, (2) compliance assistance training, and (3) on-site technical assistance and training performed by commission staff. Further provides that before the commission initiates an enforcement action for a violation committed by a small business or local government, the commission may enroll them into the program; the commission may not enroll a small business or local governments into the program if an enforcement action is required by federal law; and the commission may not initiate an enforcement action against a small business or local government for a violation that prompted enrollment in the program after the entity has successfully completed the program.
