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Standard Permit for Certain Temporary Concrete Plants for Public Works (SB 1397 Section 1, 2, 3/ Sunset Rec New)	Standard Permit for Certain Temporary Concrete Plants for Public Works - Commission may develop by rule the criteria to establish a de minimis level of air contaminants for facilities, below which certain permits are not required. The changes revise and reformat Texas Health & Safety Code Section 382.05101 and provide that a standard permit under new Section 382.051985, Standard Permit for Certain Temporary Concrete Plants for Public Works, is one of the permit types not required for facilities or groups of facilities falling below de minimis levels set forth in commission rules.
