Keep a copy of the design plan.

All irrigation systems installed since January 1, 2009, will have an irrigation plan. If you need a repair, the plan will reduce the time it takes—saving you money.

Use your watering schedule.

Your grass and plants have different watering requirements during the year. Your licensed irrigator has provided a seasonal watering plan to help reduce the amount of water you use.

Maintain your irrigation system.

Your licensed irrigator has recommended steps you can take to keep your system operating correctlythings like trimming plants or grass and changing filters will keep your yard healthy and save you money.
