Funding will be determined by using a Commissionapproved formula in the distribution of monies among selected and approved contractors by region.

Conditions for Termination of Contract. Failure to comply with contract requirements may result in the termination of the contract.

Wagner-Peyser Funding Allocation for Employment Service Activities

The Wagner-Peyser Act establishes a formula for distributing funds to states for employment service activities. With this formula, Texas will receive \$54,896,894 for Program Year 1995, beginning July 1, 1995 and ending June 30, 1996. Ninety percent of this amount must be used for basic labor exchange services under \$501, subsection 7(a); 10% will be reserved for use at the Governor's discretion within legislatively designated parameters under subsection 7(b).

Texas Labor Code, Title 4, Subtitle A, (formerly Texas Civil Statutes, Article 5221b) designates the Texas Employment Commission (TEC) as the state agency to administer activities funded by the Wagner-Peyser Act. The state herein presents the method and schedule proposed for distributing substate resources under §501, subsection 7(a).

Staff positions will be distributed to TEC administrative regions throughout the state according to the following formula: (1) each region will be held at an 80% hold harmless level, and (2) the distribution will be based upon each region's accomplishment of individual and transaction placements and new and renewal applications.

These funds will be available to support staff and nonpersonal services (rent, utilities, equipment, supplies, etc.) effective July 1, 1995. Actual disbursement of these funds will be made from the TEC State Office in accordance with the federally approved cost accounting system and state procurement guidelines.

The respective TEC regional directors have the discretion for hiring and assignment of specific individuals and for purchases and contracts for nonpersonal services within federal and state guidelines; however, these funds may not be applied to functions other than labor exchange services.

Comments in regard to the substate distribution of the Wagner-Peyser funds should be submitted in writing to Sunya Alexander, Division Director for Employment Service, TEC Building, 15th Street and Congress Avenue, Austin Texas 78778.

Information in regard to the specific allocation of any service delivery area as a result of this distribution formula is available from the same source. Any requests for modification of the distribution formula must be received by June 16, 1995, to be considered for the Program Year 1995 funding cycle. Such requests will be addressed, and a response outlining action taken will be issued by the Administrator of TEC.

The Executive Director of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC or Commission) has issued a public notice of the selection of a proposed remedy for the Unnamed Plating Superfund Site which constitutes an imminent and substantial endangerment due to a release or threatened release of hazardous substances into the environment. A copy of this notice appeared in The El Paso Times on Tuesday, May 16, 1995.

In accordance with 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §335.349(a) and the Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 361.187, a public meeting regarding the proposed remedy for the Unnamed Plating, the facility itself, and additional potentially responsible parties must be held at least 45 days after publishing a notice in the Texas Register and a local newspaper.

The public meeting is scheduled at the City Council Chambers City of El Paso, 2 Civic Center Plaza, El Paso, Texas, July 11, 1995, at 7:00 p.m.

The facility known as the Unnamed Plating site ("the Site") is located in El Paso, El Paso County, at 6816-6824 Industrial Avenue. The site covers approximately two acres in an industrial area in the southeast portion of El Paso. The site slopes four to five feet from north to south. A 13,000 square foot steel frame building is located on the western half of the site and is surrounded by a paved asphalt surface. The remainder of the site is covered by dirt at the surface. There are three closed waste ponds partially exposed on the eastern half of the site. The ponds are thought to extend westward under the asphalt and potentially under a portion of the on-site building.

This facility was utilized as a spent nickel processing and metals recovery facility from 1971 through 1979. Three surface impoundments were used to dispose of an unknown volume of waste.

The public meeting will not be a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedure Act (Texas Government Code, Chapter 2001).

Persons desiring to make comments on the facility, the identification of additional potentially responsible parties or the proposed remedial action may do so prior to or at the public meeting.
