Exide Frisco Recycling Center Closure Main Components:

- Former Operating Plant Decontamination and **Demolition** (clean and remove certain structures)
- Active Landfill Remediation (retreat certain waste in ٠ open cells)
- **Undeveloped Buffer Property Investigation and Remediation** (also known as the VCP Parcel; investigate, remediate, and certify result to obtain TCEQ Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Certificate of Completion)
- **Undeveloped Buffer Property Transfer to the** Frisco EDC and CDC
- Former Operating Plant Investigation and Remediation (investigate, remediate, and certify result for Exide retained property)
- Long Term Maintenance of Former Operating Plant (Exide retained property)

The closure of the Recycling Center will follow established regulatory processes with each step building upon the previous step and impacting the next. A simplified overview is depicted to the right. The individual task schedules are estimated based on current information and are subject to change as the process proceeds.

This project schedule will be reviewed on a weekly basis and updated as necessary.



Gather data from previous site investigations and ongoing **Develop two Affected Property Assessment Reports (APARs): VCP APAR and Former Operating Plant APAR.**

An APAR is essentially a regulatory document submitted by a property owner to the TCEQ that identifies the chemicals of concern (CoC) for the property, defines the source(s) of the CoC, determines how the CoC may or may not move through the sitespecific environment, and evaluates if pathways exist for the CoC to potentially impact human health or the environment.

The remedy will be proposed in the form of two Response Action Plans (RAPs): VCP RAP* and Former Operating Plant RAP.

A RAP is essentially a regulatory document that proposes the response action objectives, design, performance measures, confirmation sampling, post-response action care, and an

Community is kept informed of remediation activities via the public information website (i.e. air monitoring data and updates of significant activities) and quarterly public information meetings where they can ask questions to better understand ongoing

Two Response Action Completion Reports (RACRs) will document the completed remedial activities: VCP RACR and Former

A RACR is essentially a regulatory document that memorializes the response action activities and confirms compliance with the
