The Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport (DFW) is requesting the temporary suspension of monitoring requirements, specifically weekly wet weather storm water sampling, for DFW's TPDES Permit No. WQ0001441000. In response to the adjustments organizations are being asked to employ to reduce the spread of the coronavirus, DFW Airport's Environmental Affairs Department is required to implement social distancing and has transitioned to a virtual work from home strategy, which has dramatically limited the amount of staff we will have available to safely perform this duty.

Effluent Limitations and Monitoring Requirements per DFW's Individual TPDES Permit are outlined on Page 2 and 2a of the Permit. Other Requirements No. 7 in the permit provides further guidance on when stormwater sampling must be conducted. Other Requirements No. 20 states that "during normal business days and hours of operation, trained personnel shall remain on-site to perform the required outfall sampling. The permittee shall notify the TCEQ Water Quality Division, Wastewater Permitting Section (MC-148) if the hours of operation change significantly."

DFW Airport is focused on adjusting normal business operations to support the country's Pandemic response, in addition to maintaining a safe and healthy work environment for the employees and their families. DFW Environmental Affairs is requesting that the TCEQ permit DFW Airport to suspend all stormwater sampling requirements without related repercussion (i.e. enforcement action) during this time of crisis.
