Your request for enforcement discretion, as presented, relating to emissions performance testing requirements in 40 CFR §60.8(d), Special Condition No. 26 of TCEQ Permit No. 122362, and PSDTX1430 of the Marine Loading Vapor Control Units at Moda Ingleside Energy Center in Ingleside (San Patricio County) is approved with the following qualifications:

- Enforcement Discretion is limited to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. It does not limit EPA's ability enforce federal regulations;
- This enforcement discretion will be in effect until June 12, 2020. The required tests should be conducted as soon as practicable before this date, as conditions allow. Documentation of the tests must be submitted to the TCEQ Corpus Christi Region Office within 60 days of completing the tests; and
- Should an extension beyond this be needed, please submit a request to extend this date.

Dear Mr. Ruble and Mr. Garcia,

Moda Ingleside Energy Center (MIEC) is submitting this letter to request Enforcement Discretion concerning meeting the 180-day post commissioning time-frame associated with conducting Emissions Performance Testing of our new Marine Loading Vapor Control Units (VCUs). The delay in performance testing is associated with the current COVID-19 pandemic, and its negative impacts on personnel and travel, along with required social distancing.

We originally submitted the Notice of Performance Testing for our new VCUs (VCU-5, VCU-6 and VCU-7) on March 10, 2020, as required in Special Condition (SC) No. 26 of Air Permit No. 122362, PSDTX1430, and as included in 40 CFR Part 60.8(d). We expected testing to be completed the week of May 4th, 2020, as described in our original notice. Due to the COVID pandemic, this expected time frame was not achieved.

We are moving forward with testing the week of May 11, 2020 but are unsure as to whether all three VCUs can be tested within the timeframe needed, therefore are requesting enforcement discretion, as appropriate (the VCUs were originally commissioned Nov. 14 and 15, 2019).

We have been in contact with the TCEQ Region 14 Emissions Evaluator, Trent Pinion, and he is aware of the situation.

MIEC will continue to move forward with testing of the VCUs to establish minimum operating temperatures, as described in SC No. 26. A copy of the test protocol, developed by John Zink Hamworthy Combustion Air Source Testing, was previously enclosed with our original notice of testing. Results of the tests will be submitted to TCEQ within 60-days of completion.
