Chapter 50, Actions on Applications and Other Authorizations

Suggested short title: Update to 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §50.131

Introduction and reason(s) for the rulemaking:

The executive director has identified a conflict between statutory language in Texas Health and Safety Code (THSC), §382.061(b) and the implementing rules in 30 TAC §50.131 related to air quality standard permits.

Scope of the proposed rule:

The proposed rule would delete 30 TAC §50.131(c)(1). This would ensure that the commission's rules in Chapter 50 allow for an opportunity for the commission to review the executive director's (ED) decisions on air quality standard permits, in accordance with THSC, §382.061(b).

A.) Scope required by federal regulations or state statutes:

The proposed change is required to align commission rules with statutory requirements that permitting decisions made by the ED are subject to review by the commission.

B.) Additional staff recommendations:

Potential controversial concerns and legislative interest:

This rule proposal has legislative interest and has been specifically requested by members of the legislature.

Potential alternatives:

The commission could not pursue rulemaking on this issue. However, if rulemaking is not undertaken at this time, a legislative change is expected that would ensure that this rulemaking is necessary.

Effect on the:

- **A.) Regulated community:** Increased likelihood of motions to overturn being submitted on air quality standard permits issued by the ED.
- **B.)** Public: Increased opportunities to request review of issued air quality standard permits.
- **C.) Agency programs:** Air Permits Division and the Environmental Law Division could face increase in agenda notices (and related briefing) for motions to overturn on approved registrations for authorization under an air quality standard permit.
