On September 8, 2023, NGV Motori USA, LLC pleaded guilty to one first degree felony count of Theft, in violation of Texas Penal Code § 31.03.

NGV Motori USA, LLC was ordered to pay the TCEQ \$60,000 in restitution.

The TCEQ Texas Emissions Reduction Plan (TERP) program contracted with an entity to provide TERP grant funds in exchange for the entity destroying its old diesel-powered engines and replacing them with EPA certified natural gas engines. To prove destruction fraudulent affidavits were submitted to the TERP program, which stated the engines were destroyed. TCEQ ECU investigated and determined the diesel engines were not destroyed and EPA certified natural engines were not used, as required by the TERP contract.

The case was prosecuted by the Travis County District Attorney’s Office.

Texas Natural Gas Vehicles, Inc. was ordered to pay the TCEQ \$65,000 in restitution.

The TCEQ TERP program contracted with an entity to provide TERP grant funds in exchange for the entity destroying its old diesel-powered engines and replacing them with EPA certified natural gas engines. To prove destruction fraudulent affidavits were submitted to the TERP program, which stated the engines were destroyed. TCEQ ECU investigated and determined the diesel engines were not destroyed and EPA certified natural engines were not used, as required by the TERP contract.

The case was prosecuted by the Travis County District Attorney’s Office.
